RE: INFORMATION – HB 864 – Renewable Energy Portfolio Standard – Renewable **Energy Credits – Solar Energy Sources**

Dear Chair Wilson and Committee Members:

House Bill 864 changes the eligibility of solar resources under Maryland's Renewable Portfolio Standards. The Maryland Public Service Commission oversees compliance with the RPS by electricity suppliers and offers the observation below regarding the potential impacts of HB 864.

Currently, solar facilities that are not connected to the Maryland distribution grid do not qualify to generate Renewable Energy Credits that can be used to satisfy Maryland's RPS. HB 864 would allow solar generation that is not connected to the distribution grid serving Maryland to qualify as a Tier 1 resource, but not as generators of solar RECs (SRECs). This would potentially permit almost 250,000 mostly residential systems to be added as Maryland Tier 1 resources. It is unknown how many of these systems would apply for RECs in Maryland, as SREC prices are generally higher in each state with a solar carve-out.
