SHORT TITLE:	Maryland Agricultural Commission – Hemp Industry Member

EXPLANATION:

House Bill 75 would increase the membership of the Maryland Agriculture Commission from 30 to 31 members and require the additional member be appointed from the hemp industry.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Maryland Agriculture Commission is appointed by the Governor, and serves as an advisory body to the secretary and deputy secretary of the Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA).

The commission pursues the following priorities and activities:

- Encouraging the agricultural community to be more proactive on issues affecting agriculture and rural life;
- Evaluating farm/agriculture industry labor and regulations;
- Increasing public awareness of food safety; and
- Supporting the department's efforts to promote agriculture.

Recognizing that industrial hemp is an emerging industry, last year, MDA filled the vacant "At-Large Ag Services" seat on the Maryland Agriculture Commission with a representative from the hemp industry.
