Senate Bill 606 would give us the opportunity we need to obtain a liquor license through a transfer from another district that is oversaturated with licenses based on its population and not likely to be used in the future.

Further, as Baltimore County desires to promote tourism, we feel that we are 100% in line with that goal. We are a rural destination farm restaurant. People drive from all directions including the surrounding states to come to our one-of-a-kind country setting and enjoy a great meal. We are ready and would like to build on that and provide even more memorable experiences while helping Baltimore County increase tourism. We believe that a liquor license will help considerably, to attract new customers to our business including local and non-local residents.

Notwithstanding the recent events that has been very difficult for our industry to navigate, my family and I are very excited for the future of Friendly Farm. We hope to keep building our business so that perhaps the fourth generation has the opportunity to carry on the "family business".
