Re: **Support of SB 296 - Land Use - Agritourism - Definition**

On behalf of our member families, I submit this written testimony in support of SB 296, legislation that adds Camping and Incidental Outdoor Stays to the state definition of Agritourism. The bill does not require the local government to implement new regulation, but instead enables them to include Camping on farms as an agritourism activity if the county so chooses.

Camping on farms has become more and more popular because of the COVID-19 pandemic as hotel stays were difficult to get and many people wanted to stay more remote and more in the open air to remain safe. Like Air B&B, farm camping websites have been created to allow those interested a way to find places in the area they are looking to stay. Allowing farms to diversify so they can improve their income generated from the farm, should be Maryland's top priority if there is to be increased financial sustainability for our farms in the future.

Maryland Farm Bureau Policy:

- We support incidental outdoor stays as an accessory use on a working farm.
- Agritourism should be defined as activities conducted on a farm and offered to the public or to invited groups for the purpose of education, recreation, or active involvement in the farm operation.
