Support - House Bill 1060 - Residential Owners in Common Ownership Communities Bill of Rights

Chair Barve, Vice Chair Moon, and members of the Committee, it is my pleasure to provide testimony in <u>support</u> of House Bill 1060 – Residential Owners in Common Ownership Communities Bill of Rights. I would like to thank Delegate Holmes for sponsoring this important legislation, and the Committee for providing the opportunity for my testimony to be heard.

House Bill 1060 would establish additional rights for owners of property within common ownership communities. These rights would include increased access to budget documents, the ability to use association amenities at a reasonable rate, secret ballot elections for elections, proper notification of supposed violations, and many more important protections for residents. These clearly defined rights would significantly aid communities of color by ensuring that residents are not taken advantage of through outrageous fee increases, restrained access to participation in association meetings, and more.
