The Sierra Club Maryland Chapter, on behalf of our 70,000 members and supporters, urges a favorable report with amendments on HB1263.

Globally, nationwide, and in Maryland we are facing a growing, existential climate crisis. The signs are everywhere: unprecedented fires raging in California; record superstorms; analysis showing that the Colorado River has lost over a billion tons of water; huge decreases in winter snow in Maryland; flooding in Annapolis; and many, many more.

In Maryland, we have legislatively committed to significantly reducing our greenhouse gas emissions. The Greenhouse Gas Reduction Act declares that “[t]he State shall reduce statewide greenhouse gas emissions by 40% from 2006 levels by 2030.” Envir. Art. sec. 2-1204. Legislation introduced this session would update this target to 60% by 2030, to reflect recent analyses by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, and require Maryland to achieve net-zero emissions by 2045.

This bill would help advance these efforts by establishing an Office on Climate Change in the Office of the Governor. Coordination between agencies is critical for the development of long-term planning and will better enable the state to develop holistic policies that address interconnected issues, including environment, economics, race, housing, and equity.

We therefore urge a favorable report.
