I am writing on behalf of the Maryland Association of Soil Conservation Districts to express our <u>support</u> for House Bill 156, Local Governments – Urban Agricultural Incentive Zones – Authorization. This bill authorizes local governments to establish an urban agricultural zone which provides financial incentives to qualifying producers of urban agricultural operations.

Agricultural operations continue to expand within our urban landscapes in Maryland, doing everything from beekeeping to growing vegetables and flowers. Farming techniques such as vertical farming and hoop houses have been implemented to help contribute to a sustainable food network. These farmers have worked well within the urban environment, but at times face unique issues such as soil quality, stormwater management on non-agricultural parcels, neighbors, and much more. By providing these resilient farmers with additional resources and financial assistance we can help promote and grow urban agriculture within our high-density landscapes.
