Dear Chair Barve, Vice Chair Stein and members of the Environment and Transportation Committee,

On behalf of Interfaith Partners for the Chesapeake, I write to urge your support for the Maryland the Beautiful Act (HB 1031) to advance this bill favorably from committee.

Global leaders are calling for conserving 50% of Earth's landmass¹ in the fight of our lives: to combat climate change. This bill is Maryland's response to this global call to fight climate change. Our beautiful and diverse natural areas are also our best tool for climate resiliency. **With preserved forests, and increased greenspaces in urban centers, we can let nature do what it's designed to: sink carbon.**

Our world is losing species at an alarming rate: 1 million species, out of only 8 million species on the Earth, are threatened with extinction². This should alarm humans because without diverse species, we will lose essential food and medicinal sources. As people of faith, we should care about the species regardless of whether their loss will affect humans. But, for lawmakers like you, we understand that you answer to taxpayers. So, allow us to remind you that **when the planet suffers, we all suffer** – literally.

Maryland's thousands of acres of forestland serve as critical habitat for wildlife and diverse species of plants and fungi. As Maryland continues to grow, we must ensure that the natural world has space to do what it does best: **take care of us**.

HB 1031 would achieve this by setting a goal for Maryland to have 30% of its lands conserved by 2030 and 40% by 2040. And we are already close: about 28% of Maryland's lands are


protected so far³. Pushing us to the 40% by 2040 goal signals that we take seriously the well-being of all Marylanders.

While these are ambitious goals, the bill includes actionable strategies for implementation. House Bill 1031 would establish a new program called the “Greenspace Equity Program” to provide grants in underserved communities to create greenspace, and an amendment is being considered (which we support) that would require a certified land trust be involved in that work. Another program would create a Revolving Loan Fund for land trusts to help them compete in today’s real estate market. And thirdly, the bill expands the existing Mel Noland Woodland Incentives Fund to help private landowners steward forests on their properties.

As people of faith, we are urgently called to address climate change and the threats to vulnerable communities and species. The Maryland the Beautiful Act works toward a future where natural areas are valued and protected, biodiversity is recognized as our tool to fight climate change, and money is devoted to drive community-based greenspace creation.

Thank you for considering our testimony, and I urge your support for HB 1031.
