The financial opportunities created by this bill will be a great asset to current urban farmers. It will also lower some of the barriers to entry for people seeking to become farmers.

Urban farming is not a hobby. It is a viable way of feeding one's community and reducing the disparities caused by food apartheid— the systemic segregation of those who can afford healthy food and those who can not.
