What is HB 222/SB 416?

On Interstate Highways in Rural areas, this bill encourages drivers who are traveling slower than the general speed of traffic to drive in the right-hand lane(s) if practicable

Downfalls of Slow Drivers in the Left Lane

- Research shows that two cars riding side-by-side going the same speed can result in major traffic buildups¹
- You might remember from years ago the moving road block on I-95, creating congestion



- The more congestion, the higher risk of accidents
- Slow drivers in the left lane force motorists who want to pass, to pass on the right and to dart around traffic to move forward

How Would It Be Enforced?


- ▶ It would not be enforced
- ► The law simply places signs along rural interstates advising motorist of safe driving habits

Educating Drivers

- ► This bill focuses heavily on educating drivers
- ► The State Highway Administration would be required to educate drivers about the new policy by:
 - ▶ Placing and maintaining signs at regular intervals on appropriate highways
 - ▶ Using the Dynamic Message Sign System located throughout the state

Other States

- Maryland is one of only a few states that allows drivers to use the left lane other than for passing
- By placing signs along Maryland rural highway, we are educating drivers which will help them to avoid getting stopped in other states that do enforce this a law



Be Courteous

- It is courteous to move over into the right lanes when you do not have an immediate reason to be in the left lane
- By allowing others to pass, and helping relieve congestion, drivers will experience a more pleasant and more efficient drive

By passing HB 222/SB 416, we will be voting to create safer interstates, reduce congestion, and encourage more courteous driving
