RE: HB 911 - Health Occupations - Psychologists - Doctoral Degrees - Letter of Concern

Dear Chair Pendergrass and Committee Members:

The Maryland Board of Examiners of Psychologists (the Board) is submitting this Letter of Concern on House Bill (HB) 911 - Health Occupations – Psychologists - Doctoral Degrees.

HB 911 appears to lower the requirements for licensure to practice as a clinical psychologist in Maryland by reducing the education, practicum experience, and supervision that is needed to provide the highest level of mental health services.

The Board supports the expansion of qualified psychologists. However, it is equally essential that the quality of mental health services provided to Marylanders is not compromised. HB 911 presents many variables that can lower the current standard of care and reduce the protection of the public:

- The admission requirements for re-specialization programs vary, leaving it up to the re-specialization programs to determine the requirements.
- Less clinical-based coursework and supervision than the "traditional" route.
- A certificate is received after completion, instead of a doctoral degree in psychology approved by the American Psychological Association.

Again, the Board supports the expansion of qualified mental health practitioners and will continue to examine this issue to determine what safeguards might be put in place to accomplish this goal. However, to ensure that the same or a higher level of mental health services are provided, the Board respectfully asks that you consider this information and agree that the risk of compromising the quality of mental health services may be greater than the intent of HB 911.
