Written Testimony of Wes Moore Former Army Captain and Candidate for Governor Before the House Health and Government Operations Committee Burial in State Veterans' Cemeteries - Spouses and Dependents FAVORABLE (House Bill 1251)

Chair Pendergrass, Vice Chair Pena Melnyk, and Members of the House Government and Operations Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony in support of **House Bill 1251**, **Burial in State Veterans' Cemeteries - Spouses and Dependents**.
