110,000 Marylanders are living with Alzheimer's and other dementia.

\$1.231 billion spent in Medicaid costs on Alzheimer's and other dementia (2020).

3rd highest percentage of adults who are dementia caregivers.

68.8% of caregivers have chronic health conditions.

DIRECTOR OF DEMENTIA SERVICES COORDINATION

- This legislation would establish a full-time Director of Dementia Services Coordination within the Maryland Department of Health.
- The position will be responsible for the coordination of services affecting Marylanders with dementia and their caregivers and families, including:
 - implementing the Maryland Alzheimer's state plan managing the Virginia I. Jones Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Council.
 - identifying and supporting the development of dementiaspecific training.
 - applying for grants to expand and improve services for Marylanders with Alzheimer's and their caregivers.

WHAT CAN MARYLAND DO?

- 1. ENACT legislation that establishes the Director of Dementia Services Coordination in the Maryland Department of Health.
