I am a constituent of Gaithersburg, MD and urge committee members to support this bill. VAERS is a critical warning signal tool that has been around since 1990. In response to NCVIA, CDC and FDA established VAERS to aid in compensating individuals of all ages who have been injured by vaccines that are listed in the vaccine injury table. While this compensation is important, I find it even more important that adverse events be reported for scientific knowledge and research purposes. It's a flagging system that alerts us when something may be wrong with a specific product or lot#. It's imperative that adverse events are reported, particularly for new vaccines. Sadly, VAERS is showing more adverse reactions from the COVID vaccinations than all other vaccines combined. For that, it's being called inaccurate, fraudulent, unreliable.
