(II) A **PRACTICE-ORIENTED** POSTDOCTORAL RESPECIALIZTION CERTIFICATE [FROM A PROGRAM THAT AT THE TIME THE CERTIFICATE WAS AWARDED WAS OFFERED THROUGH] WHICH WAS ISSUED BY A DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY THAT AT THE TIME THE CERTIFICATE WAS ISSUED HAD A DEGREE PROGRAM THAT WAS [IS] ACCREDITED BY THE AMERICAN PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION OR THE CANADIAN PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION:

HB 911 allows an efficient and effective mechanism for individuals who obtained a doctoral degree in psychology, but did not specialize in the provision of clinical care to clients, to obtain the education, training, and experience necessary to deliver clinical services and meet the criteria set for licensure by Maryland law.

This bill is a small step towards providing increased access to mental health care for Marylanders. As a result of the recent and ongoing pandemic, it has become clear that the need for mental health services is fast outstripping the ability of currently licensed providers to provide mental health care to those in need. Not only must we increase access to care, but we must be careful to maintain the quality of mental health care that is delivered to our citizens. This bill ensures that those who seek a respecialization certificate meet the same standards as those who graduated from degree programs that are accredited by both the American Psychological Association and the Canadian Psychological Association.

Finally, we believe this bill minimizes the administrative impact on the Maryland Board of Examiners of Psychologists while providing an avenue for increased access to quality mental health care.

For these reasons, and many others, the MPA STRONGLY urges the House Health and Government Operations Committee to issue a favorable report on HB 911.
