Since that time, it has reviewed programs and services for people with disabilities, identified barriers to programs and services available to people with disabilities, recommended ways to overcome those barriers, and made recommendations regarding existing and proposed legislation pertaining to people with disabilities.

The Commission strongly support HB 1238 – Open Captioning at Movie Theatres, which Delegate Bhandari sponsors. This bill ensures that movie theatres provide two days of the week with all the movies being open captioning. Captioning benefits everyone, including deaf people, hard of hearing people, people who are learning English and also children/adults who are learning to read.
