RE: HB1299 - Corrections - Housing - Serious Mental Illness

Dear Chair Clippinger and Members of the Committee,

The Maryland Psychological Association (MPA), which represents over 1,000 doctoral-level psychologists from throughout the state, is writing in support of **HB1299: Corrections - Serious Mental Illness** which would provide certain inmates with a serious mental illness an opportunity to spend a certain amount of time each day out of their locked room or cell with certain limits and safeguards.

It has been recognized that significant segregation from others for extended periods of time can have a deleterious impact upon inmates emotional and behavioral states, especially those who are already vulnerable due to serious mental health concerns. A large portion of inmates in correctional settings experience significant mental health concerns, and that many of those inmates have serious/chronic forms of mental illness. This bill takes important steps to ensure that, as appropriate, these individuals should have an opportunity to spend time outside of their locked cell or room. We welcome the opportunity to discuss this bill in greater detail and offer our support.

For these reasons, the Maryland Psychological Association asks for a **FAVORABLE** report on **HB 1299**.
