It has been recognized that significant segregation from others for extended periods of time can have a deleterious impact upon inmates emotional and behavioral states, especially those who are already vulnerable due to serious mental health concerns. A large portion of inmates in correctional settings experience significant mental health concerns, and that many of those inmates have serious/chronic forms of mental illness. This bill takes important steps to ensure that, as appropriate, these individuals should have an opportunity to spend time outside of their locked cell or room.
