Chairman Clippinger, Vice-Chair Moon, House Judiciary Committee, thank you for considering HB262 entitled "Family Law – Nonpayment of Child Support – Sentencing." This bill will serve to help families and children all across our state.

Early in my time as a family law attorney, I overheard another attorney bragging about getting a person sentenced to 12 years for failure to pay child support. I was, of course, shocked by the brazenness of this individual, but also concerned about how this loophole in our code was allowing for such extreme sentencing to take place. Sentences like this disregard the original intent of the law.

HB262 intends to close the loophole in Family Law, Section 10 - 203 which currently does not exclude the possibility of a noncustodial parent in a failure to pay child support case from serving multiple consecutive sentences, potentially incurring incarceration for the entire time their children remain a minor, as was the situation in the courtroom that day.

And to what end? Excessive incarceration in child support enforcement cases is unnecessarily costly to the state and both parents involved in the proceedings. It is most certainly unproductive in procuring owed child support payments, and most importantly it is detrimental to the emotional support of children who will be better served by the involvement and presence of both

their parents. It is my intention with this bill to prevent excessive incarceration for the betterment of state and family values.
