Child Custody – Cases Involving Child Abuse or Domestic Violence – Training for Judges and Child's Counsel

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Judiciary, in consultation with certain 5 organizations, to develop a training program for judges presiding over child custody 6 cases involving child abuse or domestic violence and to review and update the 7 training program at certain intervals; requiring the training program to include 8 certain information; requiring the Maryland Judiciary to make information on a 9 certain training program available on request; requiring the Maryland Judiciary to adopt procedures to identify child custody cases that may involve child abuse or 10 11 domestic violence as soon as possible for a certain purpose; requiring the Maryland 12 Judiciary to order a certain danger and lethality assessment to be conducted if the 13 court has reasonable grounds to believe that a child custody or visitation case may involve child abuse or domestic violence; requiring a judge to receive certain training 14 or continued training before the judge is authorized to preside over a child custody 15 16 case involving child abuse or domestic violence; requiring an individual to receive 17 certain training or retraining before the individual is authorized to serve as a child's 18 counsel in a child custody case involving child abuse or domestic violence; defining a 19 certain term; providing for a delayed effective date for certain provisions of this Act; 20 and generally relating to the training of judges and child's counsel for child custody cases involving child abuse or domestic violence. 21
