I have participated in city, county and state forums in which Democrat representatives have defined federal immigration detainers as "requests" for detention. Detainers are in fact federal red flags signaling local jurisdictions that persons involved in criminal, often violent criminal activity, terrorism or espionage are present in their judicial system.

Delegate Szeliga's bill, HB 756, is an effort to stem the coddling of illegal alien criminals by the state of Maryland.
