<u>In Support of HB 118 (2022)</u>: Public Schools – Student Attendance – Excused Absences for Mental Health Needs.

In light of the ongoing Covid 19 pandemic and beyond, students should be given the flexibility, health care services and support to take time away from school as they adjust to being back learning in person. And the many realities that have been brought about by the pandemic.

We trust that any time off or excused absences would be tracked and reported by the school to the child's school support staff, medical team members and also tracked by MSDE. Especially in the case where a student might then qualify for ongoing mental health support, social service supports and mental health counseling services.
