My name is Kristi Rotz, and together my husband and I own and operate Antietam Entertainment LLC, a dinner theatre in Hagerstown, MD. Together, we strongly support SB 533, which would repeal the 10% Admission & Amusement Tax in Washington County.

While the cost of food, labor and materials continue to rise, in order to maintain our business, so do our prices. A large demographic of our patrons are senior citizens on a fixed income, and the 10% Admission & Amusement tax is negatively affecting the affordability of family friendly entertainment in Washington County.

The issue of this Admission & Amusement tax is exacerbated by the fact that we live in the Tri-State area and are among the only county to impose such a tax. The Board of County Commissioners of Washington County, Maryland (the "Board"), by a vote of 5-0, opposes Senate Bill 533. Senate Bill 533 repeals the authority of Washington County and municipal corporations in Washington County to impose an admissions and amusement tax.

This bill seeks removal of enabling legislation that allows local governing bodies to impose an admissions and amusement tax on certain taxable entertainment activities. The Board opposes this bill because it unfairly targets Washington County and its municipalities with repeal of taxing authority that other counties and municipalities possess. The Board believes that the decision to impose or forego this tax should be made locally by governing bodies assessing local economic conditions. The enabling authority provides localities with flexibility to adjust taxing policy based on local needs.

In Washington County, the Board is considering whether to terminate collection of the admissions and amusement tax. However, the Board would like to retain the authority to impose or forego the tax based on future economic conditions. The Board further believes that municipalities in Washington County should have the same policy discretion.

For the foregoing reasons, the Board of County Commissioners of Washington County respectfully urges the Committee to act unfavorably on SB 533.

Please accept this letter as written testimony of the City of Hagerstown's governing body in **<u>opposition</u>** of this proposed legislation.

The Admissions and Amusement (A&A) tax has long been applicable in the City of Hagerstown, as well as throughout all municipalities and Washington County Government, to aid in the funding of additional services provided to those charging the A&A tax in holding events where for-profit revenue is being received. The A&A tax charged within the City of Hagerstown is 10% of gross receipts, except:

- 3% of gross receipts for admission charges to any theater, opera or concert
- 3% of gross receipts from bingo operations
- 5% of gross receipts derived from concessions and carnivals
- 5% of gross receipts derived from shows and exhibits
- No A&A is received from qualified entities / activities within our Arts and Entertainment District.

A repeal of this tax would eliminate **\$350,000** immediately from the general fund of the City of Hagerstown, with forecasts showing at least a **\$500,000** deficit in FY26.

Admissions and amusement taxes are usually charged by state and local governments as a way to generate revenue for public services and programs. The ability for a municipality in Maryland to generate revenue is very limited. By charging this tax, municipalities and the County can fund public services such as education, public transportation, parks, and other infrastructure. The City, in order to continue to provide services utilizing these funds, would need to find the revenue from another source or forego potentially a service that our residents and visitors deem important.

In addition to generating revenue, admissions and amusement taxes can also serve as a way to promote local tourism and entertainment industries. By providing funding for public services and infrastructure, governments can create an environment that attracts visitors and encourages businesses to invest in the area. This can lead to increased economic growth and job creation.

The City of Hagerstown urges the committee to <u>NOT SUPPORT</u> SB533 and not allow it to move forward out of this committee.
