Chair and members of the Committee, my name is Judy Mickens-Murray and I serve as the Chairperson of the Prince George's County Board of Education. After careful consideration by the Board's Policy & Governance Committee, I would like to share the sentiments of the

Board on several pending bills.

HB 0437

The proposed Office of Accountability and Compliance threatens the Board of Education as an independent governing body and undermines the will and voting rights of the electorate to choose individuals of their preference to oversee the governance, administration, and provision of public education in Prince George's County.

We can identify only Montgomery County with such an office, and the County Inspector General in that county has oversight authority over multiple county agencies, including county government. We object to Prince George's County Public Schools being targeted and singled out in this manner.

The establishment of this office would be a duplication of responsibilities already vested in and discharged by the Office of Internal Audit (OIA) which reports to the Board of Education.

The functions proposed for the Office of Accountability and Compliance are repetitive to the OIA as well as the Maryland Office of the Inspector General for Education. OIA has and continues to effectively provide oversight of school district management, operates with tremendous transparency, provides timely and public reporting on investigations and prompt management response, and is accessible to public inquiries.

The existing OIA falls within acceptable audit practices, overseeing the management of the school district with a reporting line to the Board of Education. It is a fully staffed and budgeted office. Creation of the Office of Accountability and Compliance would come at great and unnecessary public expense, while not providing any greater oversight than currently provided by the OIA.

We respectfully ask you to oppose HB 437.
