POSITION: SUPPORT

The Maryland Chiefs of Police Association (MCPA) and the Maryland Sheriffs' Association (MSA) **SUPPORT** HB 208. This bill is intended to address public safety situations that occur from street racing and exhibition driving. The bill increases the points on an individual's license and the penalties associated with these activities.

Across Maryland, there have been continual concerns regarding the safety of our roadways due to the reckless and careless driving engaged in by Street Racers and Exhibition Drivers. The actions of these drivers, who often conduct such activities with large groups of competitors and observers, often cause roadways to be closed to other traffic, including first responders en route to provide care for others. They also cause others using our roadways, including pedestrians and bicyclists, to be placed in grave danger due to their actions. These actions include conducting speed contests on our roads, closing roadways with vehicles and human chains, and conducting exhibition driving activities - all with a careless disregard for others. These activities have been ongoing across our state for several years and require legislation to properly address such activities, help preserve the safety and welfare of all, and achieve our goals of reducing traffic and pedestrian-related fatalities and injuries.

Legislation recently passed to establish "special event zones" in Ocean City to address these types of events has been extremely effective. HB 208 extends these measures statewide.

HB 208 proposes a reasonable solution to address the egregious behavior of street racing and exhibition driving. For this reason, MCPA and MSA **SUPPORT** HB 208 and urge a **FAVORABLE** Committee report.

Dear Chair Delegate Barve, Vice Chair Delegate Stein, and Members of the Environment & Transportation Committee:

Thank you, Delegate Lehman and the 45 other Delegate sponsors for introducing HB208. This is a much-needed bill for local jurisdictions in Maryland.

While drag racing and exhibition driving has always been a problem, the instances of such activity grew exponentially during the COVID quarantine and became commonplace in many communities. Meet ups were planned via social media, large groups of cars would gather to race down major State roads and local streets, and local police were at a loss about how to stop this activity given the number of vehicles and the ability for the cars to disperse quickly.

As a Councilmember in Howard County, I am aware that most residents would welcome prohibitions and increased penalties for this type of activity. Complaints about loud engines and car racing frequently fill my Council inbox and were one of the most common concerns I heard when I was door knocking during my reelection campaign. My Councilmanic District is bounded by Route 29 and Route 108 and bisected by Route 32. Loud engine noise and car racing is a frequent occurrence on all of these roads. I know this because I hear it from Route 32 in my home almost every night. Not only does this activity take place on our major roads, it also occurs in the parking lots at the Columbia Mall, our Village Centers, including one that was defaced with tire tracks from a pop-up rally, and on local neighborhood streets creating extremely loud disturbances.

Our County has attempted to address the issue but has expressed the need for more tools to be successful. On August 8, 2022, one of our Columbia Village Boards held a town hall to discuss issues involving cars with modified engines racing through neighborhoods, disturbing the peace, and illegal street racing. I attended the meeting as a panelist, as did other elected officials, the Howard County Police Chief Der, and Police Major Justin Baker, who directs field operations.

Chief Der stated that the problem of car rallies started in October 2020 and that in May 2021 police throughout the state started working cooperatively because the situation had escalated to

Chief Der noted that the police monitor social media for rally locations to prevent gatherings designed to disturb the peace and endanger public safety. Major Baker stated that the most effective deterrent at present is the equipment repair order, which requires modified exhaust systems to be restored to factory settings.

Former State Delegate Reid Novotny, another panelist that evening, related an incident he witnessed when returning home on Route 32 one evening with his child. He and nearby cars were brought to a stop by drag racers so that they could conduct an impromptu car race on the State highway. Needless to say, he expressed concern about the safety of his child during a routine trip home.

At the end of the town hall, the panel discussed the 2022 General Assembly bill that would have given police the ability to impound on site but was vetoed by Governor Hogan. The police in attendance that night felt that any increased penalties or powers would help improve responses to the calls that they get. We need to find more proactive ways to remove these dangerous drivers from our roads and this bill will go a long way to help in that effort.

I urge all of you to vote in favor of HB208. Thank your time and consideration.

I am writing to show my strong support for House Bill (HB) 208 on behalf of State's Attorney Aisha Braveboy and to urge a favorable report. I am an Assistant State's Attorney in the Special Prosecutions Unit in the State's Attorney's Office for Prince George's County.

As a member of the Special Prosecutions Unit, I prosecute, among other offenses, vehicular homicides and negligent driving resulting in life-threatening injuries. As a result, I am all too familiar with the reality that very many of the horrendous collisions the Special Prosecutions Unit investigates result from individuals who are engaged in street racing or simply "showing off," almost always in the pursuit of content to post on social media (such as Instagram and the like).

The provisions proposed under HB 208 to enhance penalties for highway racing and speed contests are well-justified and will strengthen the hand of law enforcement in quelling such conduct. So, too, will the proposed provisions empowering police officers to tow and impound vehicles utilized in these dangerous activities, especially if a conviction under these statutes can result in forfeiture of the seized vehicle. For these reasons, among others, I strongly support HB 208.

For the foregoing reasons, I respectfully urge a favorable report, and ultimately passage, on HB 208.

The Prince George's County Municipal Association (PGCMA) writes to **SUPPORT House Bill 208 - Street Racing and Exhibition Driving - Prohibited Acts, Enforcement, and Penalties** which would increase penalties and points assessments for violations related to participation in racing or speed contests. The bill would also establish a statewide prohibition on exhibition driving on any highway or private property that is used for driving by the general public. Additionally, the bill would authorize a police officer to order the towing and impounding of a vehicle that is driven in a race or speed contest or is the subject of an exhibition driving violation.

PGCMA recognizes that there are serious concerns for public safety upon our roadways due to intentionally dangerous driving engaged by Street Racers and Exhibition Drivers. Aside from the illegality of their fast driving, the recklessness of their decision making to get ahead of the competitors puts all parties at a hazardous risk for injury. This includes behavior such as weaving through roads, running stop signs or red lights and intentionally abrupt acceleration or braking. These activities typically occur in larger groups, contributing to traffic congestion and can even block first responders from being able to reach their emergency calls. No citizen in Maryland should have to bear the consequences of another individual's choice to drive recklessly.

This bill would send a strong message that Street Races and Exhibition Driving is strictly prohibited in Maryland as there will be penalties for such reckless behavior whether you are a driver or a spectator. For these reasons we believe this public safety measure will benefit municipalities in Prince George's County and across the state. Therefore, PGCMA respectfully requests a **favorable** report for **House Bill 208**. Thank you.

My name is John Seng, volunteer Chair and founder of the Maryland Coalition For Roadway Safety, Inc.

Our 200+ member organization strongly supports the enactment of HB208, the "Street Racing and Exhibition Driving – Prohibited Acts, Enforcement, and Penalties" bill.

We request that the House Environment and Transportation Committee submit a favorable review of this bill to address a major threat to public safety and the welfare of our communities.

The Problem

It's truly "battle stations." The public is fed up. Frankly, authorities are long overdue to take significant steps to stem the increased tide of mayhem on our streets, roads, bridges and town centers. Our roadways and intersections erupt into chaotic, dangerous playgrounds, caused by individuals who size up law enforcement and government as too weak-willed and ill-equipped to discourage or intervene.

People in municipalities across Maryland and residents are threatened by overt lawless behavior in the form of street racing, rallies, tire burnouts, and on and on. This as-yet unchecked behavioral trend erodes confidence in government and its ability to enforce laws that exist to benefit – and especially – protect all.

We recognize the potential for serious injury and death as real and frightening. And please consider the disruption to businesses and homeowners. What's more, this behavior further taxes an already strained, embattled and understaffed police departments.

Take This Necessary Step Towards A Solution

SafeRoadsMD agrees with the Bill's sponsors that the best answer is to markedly increase sanctions to deter criminal behavior. Increase the cost of illegal and unruly harmful behavior.

The strengthened and, importantly, when published and enforced sanctions of HB208 will send a powerful message that Maryland lawmakers take this growing problem seriously and intend to restore safety and calm on roads and in communities: That continued roadway disruptions will not be tolerated, and violators will face serious sanctions.

Alarmed by growing roadway violence in Maryland, we were established to call more attention to and combat the onslaught of speed and noise on our roads. The *Coalition* represents the interests of communities and individuals who directly suffer the consequences of illegal operation of motor vehicles.

The persistent toll that should concern us all? 2023 finished poorly as the sixth consecutive year in which between 500-600 people died from Maryland roadway violence.

HB 208- Altering certain penalties and the points assessments for certain motor vehicle violations related to participation in a race or speed contest; prohibiting a person from engaging in exhibition driving on any highway or private property used for driving by the public; authorizing the towing and impounding of a vehicle involved in violations related to participation in a race, speed contest, or exhibition driving; providing penalties of imprisonment up to 1 year or a fine up to \$1,000, or both in the event of bodily injury; etc. Effective June 1, 2023.

This bill increases penalties and points assessments for violations related to participation in racing or speed contests. The bill also establishes a statewide prohibition on exhibition driving on any highway or private property that is used for driving by the general public. Additionally, the bill authorizes a police officer to order the towing and impounding of a vehicle that is driven in a race or speed contest or is the subject of an exhibition driving violation.

HB208 Has the potential to increase safety on State roads and Highways. Due to penalty provisions, minimal increase in general fund revenues and potential minimal increase in general fund expenditures. Transportation Trust Fund (TTF) revenues are not materially affected; the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) can implement the bill with existing resources. The Judiciary can handle the increased workload with existing resources. Enforcement can be handled with existing resources. Additionally, Prince Georges County Council has historically supported this measure in past sessions.

For the foregoing reasons, we believe the residents of Maryland will benefit greatly from the increased safety aspects of this measure. Prince George's County Council SUPPORTS this measure and respectfully requests a favorable report from this committee on this legislation.

I have served on the Prince George's County wide Fire Chiefs CAC and represented my community on the local Police district CAC. I am back again like I promised last year when I testified for similar legislation.

How? When and Why??? Did Someone's ENTERTAINMENT become More important than SOMEONES LIFE???

From the moment I saw I 95 closed for Stunt Drivers Entertainment in 2021. My 1st thoughts were of Potential Innocent Victims When Entertainment Road Closures delay. Entertainment Road Closures is the answer.

Racing parties create 3 types of victims:

House Bill 208 would change the penalties and points assessed for motorists engaging in exhibition driving on any highway or private property that is used for driving by the public and would authorize the police to tow and impound involved vehicles.

Exhibition driving means intentionally driving a vehicle in a manner that disturbs the peace by creating unnecessary engine noise, and associated tire squeals or sliding caused by the car's abrupt accelerating and braking. Montgomery County has experienced an increasing number of "car meet-ups" whereby large groups of people converge at pre-designated locations to cheer and encourage street racing. The events have resulted in unauthorized closures of public roadways and have endangered drivers and pedestrians alike in our communities. House Bill 208 would enhance public safety by sending a strong message to everyone that street racing and exhibition driving is strictly prohibited and that those engaged in it will be penalized.

I respectfully request that the Environment and Transportation Committee vote favorable on the bill.

UNDER STATE LAW TO CRACK DOWN ON EXHIBITION DRIVING IN OCEAN CITY.

THOSE CONCERNS HAVE BEEN ADDRESSED.

THERE ARE FOUR MAIN DETERRENTS IN THIS BILL THAT WILL HELP REDUCE THE NUMBER OF THESE CONTESTS AND SEND A CLEAR MESSAGE TO IN-STATE AND OUT-OF-STATE DRIVERS AND REPEAT OFFENDERS THAT WE TAKE THESE DANGEROUS CONTESTS SERIOUSLY.

THE BILL DOES FOUR MAIN THINGS:

- FIRST, THE BILL MANDATES A COURT APPEARANCE; CURRENTLY A DRIVER
 IN A CAR CONTEST CAN PRE-PAY ANY FINES THAT ARE ASSESSED.
 WORCESTER COUNTY HAS BEEN ABLE TO REDUCE SPEED CONTESTS
 SIGNIFICANTLY BY REQUIRING MOTORISTS TO GO TO COURT AND FACE A
 JUDGE.
- SECONDLY, THE BILL INCREASES THE POINTS ASSESSED AGAINST DRIVERS

- THIRDLY, IT AUTHORIZES A FINE OF UP TO \$1,000 UPON CONVICTION FOR A
 CONTEST WITH OR WITHOUT BODILY INJURY, UP FROM \$500.
- FINALLY, IT GIVES OFFICERS DISCRETION TO IMPOUND THE VEHICLE WHEN
 WARRANTED FOR SAFETY REASONS HAVING TO DO WITH THE CAR OR THE
 DRIVER FOR EXAMPLE THE CAR ITSELF IS UNSAFE OR THE DRIVER HAS A

SUSPENDED LICENSE OR IS UNLICENSED. OFFICERS ALREADY HAVE THIS DISCRETION FOR OTHER TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS.

MR. CHAIR, COLLEAGUES, THESE CONTESTS HAVE GROWN IN FREQUENCY IN PART BECAUSE OUR EXISTING LAW IS TOO LAX. ABSENT MORE SERIOUS PENALTIES, EXHIBITION DRIVING WILL CONTINUE TO BE A SERIOUS PROBLEM. THANK YOU FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION. I URGE YOUR FAVORABLE REPORT.

POSITION: SUPPORT

The Maryland Chiefs of Police Association (MCPA) and the Maryland Sheriffs' Association (MSA) **SUPPORT** HB 208. This bill is intended to address public safety situations that occur from street racing and exhibition driving. The bill increases the points on an individual's license and the penalties associated with these activities.

Across Maryland, there have been continual concerns regarding the safety of our roadways due to the reckless and careless driving engaged in by Street Racers and Exhibition Drivers. The actions of these drivers, who often conduct such activities with large groups of competitors and observers, often cause roadways to be closed to other traffic, including first responders en route to provide care for others. They also cause others using our roadways, including pedestrians and bicyclists, to be placed in grave danger due to their actions. These actions include conducting speed contests on our roads, closing roadways with vehicles and human chains, and conducting exhibition driving activities - all with a careless disregard for others. These activities have been ongoing across our state for several years and require legislation to properly address such activities, help preserve the safety and welfare of all, and achieve our goals of reducing traffic and pedestrian-related fatalities and injuries.

Legislation recently passed to establish "special event zones" in Ocean City to address these types of events has been extremely effective. HB 208 extends these measures statewide.

HB 208 proposes a reasonable solution to address the egregious behavior of street racing and exhibition driving. For this reason, MCPA and MSA **SUPPORT** HB 208 and urge a **FAVORABLE** Committee report.

- AAA Mid-Atlantic **supports House Bill 208**, which increases penalties for those participating in illegal racing or speed contests on Maryland roads; establishes a **statewide ban** on exhibition driving on any highway or private property that is used for driving by the general public; and, authorizes a police officer to order the towing and impounding of a vehicle that is driven in a race or is the subject of an exhibition driving violation.
- The bottom line is—speed kills—and our roadways and parking lots are not race tracks.
- Recently, law enforcement across the country, and here in Maryland, have cited an increase in street racing.
- In May 2019, 19-year old, Zach Friedlander and his dog were killed in Baltimore County as a result of a crash where the driver who hit him was reportedly street racing and driving at 116 mph in a 35 mph zone.
- In 2009, two people were killed and two more were seriously injured in Woodlawn as a result of illegal street racing on Interstate 70.
- And, in 2008, eight people were killed in Prince George's County when the driver of a car that was participating in an illegal race crashed into a crowd of spectators.
- In 2021, according to a <u>Washington Post article</u>, Maryland State Police conducted a joint law enforcement initiative focused on speeding and aggressive driving for a four-day period on Interstate 70, which resulted in the issuance of more than 300 traffic citations and warnings.
- While recent research by the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety found that even modestly higher speeds at the time of a crash dramatically increase the chances of severe injury and death, these dangerous illegal street races amplify those risks.
- Illegal street racing endangers everyone, including spectators. The reckless and irresponsible actions of those who choose to treat our roads as a race track have resulted in traffic disruption and fatalities on our roads.
- On behalf of AAA Mid-Atlantic's over one million Maryland members, we urge the Committee to give **HB 208** a **favorable** report.
