Statement of Mike Moses Maryland Military Coalition HB 250 – Vehicle Laws - Disabled Veteran Registration Plates - Issuance February 9, 2023

FAVORABLE

Good afternoon, Madam Chair, Vice Chair and Honorable Committee Members.

My name is Mike Moses, Director of the Maryland Military Coalition and resident of Charles County, Waldorf, Maryland, and Navy Veteran.

Many Veterans after serving in the Vietnam War, Persian Gulf, and the Iraq and Afghanistan conflict have struggled when they returned home. Transitioning back into civilian life is by far their biggest battle. During the changeover, Veterans worry about bills, food, and other small things on a daily basis.

On countless occasions during the transition, the home population expresses its appreciation with statements of gratitude such as "Thank You For Your Service." And, there are benefits from federal and state governments, though some are with limitations.

One particular limitation in our state, pertaining to the honoring of our veterans, is the one with the Motor Vehicle Administration that allows <u>ONLY a Veteran, who is 100%</u> <u>disabled</u>, free registration for all license fees.

As a former Southern Maryland Area Veteran Service Officer, I have coached veterans using the <u>VA</u> E-Benefit Data Base and VetPro in addressing Veteran Claims. In the state of Maryland there are 38,161 Veterans who have received a rating of at least 50% to 90% disability according to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and these veterans should be given this Veteran preference.

Let us continue to articulate our thanks to our disabled veterans' service with a positive vote for HB 250 and **lower the free registration to those vehicle owners with military service-related injuries of at least 50%** as designated or classified by the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs.
