The House Environment and Transportation Committee SB 823 – Natural Resources – Annual State Park Pass – Discounts for Law Enforcement Officers and First Responders Statement of Support by Bill Sponsor Senator Mary Beth Carozza

Thank you, Chair Barve, Vice Chair Stein, and members of the distinguished House Environment and Transportation Committee for allowing me to present Senate Bill 823 – Natural Resources - Annual State Park Pass - Discounts for Law Enforcement Officers and First Responders. I want to thank Secretary Kurtz and staff from the Maryland Department of Natural Resources for working with me on this legislation.

The best ideas for legislation come from the front lines with our constituents, and that was the case when Steve Mizell, a retiree from the Salisbury Fire Department came forward during the Interim with a suggestion that ultimately became Senate Bill 823. Mr. Mizell, who has openly discussed his challenges with Post-Traumatic Stress Syndrome (PTSD), contacted me about his idea to offer a State Park Pass discount for first responders.

The Maryland Park Service passport allows for unlimited day-use admission to Maryland's state parks and facilities, unlimited boat launching at all applicable state park facilities and a ten percent discount on state-operated concession items and boat rentals. These passes currently cost \$75 for Maryland residents and this legislation would create a \$40 discount for law enforcement officers and first responders, including firefighters, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, and 911 specialists who are Maryland residents.

We learned during the COVID-19 pandemic that access to the outdoors is essential for health and wellbeing. Maryland State Parks saw a 44% increase in visitation during the first six months of 2020 alone and it has been estimated that spending two hours or more outside each week positively impacts general health and wellbeing.

The public safety sector has been facing an acute workforce shortage that puts our neighborhoods and communities at risk. The Maryland State Firemen's Association and the Maryland Association of Counties have already partnered to support Senate Bill 414, Senator Augustine's bill to form a task force to prioritize incentives to increase retention and recruitment for our firefighters, EMS, 911, and law enforcement. Senate Bill 823 simply allows our first responders and their families to benefit from the State Park pass discount effective this year.

Our first responders and law enforcement officers are on the front lines every day protecting our communities in high-stress environments. Maryland already offers veterans of the Armed Forces a day-use waiver, allowing them to enjoy our State Parks for free. Giving our emergency responders their own discount is a simple, meaningful way to not only thank them for their service but to promote the health and well-being of our first responders.

Also, I respectfully request your support for the amendment I have shared with you to move the effective date from October 1 to June 1 in order for our first responders to enjoy the discount this summer.

I want to thank the Fire/EMS Coalition and the Maryland State Firemen's Association for their support. I truly appreciate your kind attention and consideration, and I respectfully ask for a swift and favorable report on SB 823.

Good afternoon, Chairman Barve and, members of the committee.

My name is Stephen Mizell and, I am here today to urge a favorable report to Senator Carozza's Bill, SB 823.

I am a retired firefighter/EMT-B from the City of Salisbury with 24 years in the fire service.

As you can imagine, during my 24 years as a firefighter, I have seen gruesome things.

Time went by, and I keep these traumatic events to myself because I did not want to be seen as weak.

As a result, my mental health suffered.

Over the years, I have been diagnosed with anxiety, depression, and alcoholism.

Following my retirement, I was diagnosed with PTSD.

Now, here is the good news.

Anxiety, depression, alcoholism, and PTSD are treatable

I quit drinking in 2017.

In January of 2022 I found a therapist who specializes in helping law enforcement officers and first responders and that has been a tremendous help.

One of the recommendations that I received from my therapist was to spend more time outdoors.

I will use the remainder of my time explaining how this has helped me and could benefit others.

I do not handle being in large, noisy crowds very well.

Last year, I explored Assateague State Park for the first time.

I found that Assateague was large enough that overcrowding usually was not an issue and the noise levels did not bother me.

In fact, I did not experience any noticeable anxiety at all.

Another added benefit to visiting Assateague was my wife and I had a peaceful place where we could spend time together. This helped us reconnect with each other and improved our marriage.

Finally, the time spent outdoors in the sun, sand and water greatly improved my mood.

There are many components involved in improving the mental health of law enforcement officers and first responders and spending time in nature is just one of them

Allowing law enforcement officers and first responders to obtain an Annual State Park Pass at a discounted rate would help remove a barrier to a resource that could improve their mental health.

Once again, I urge a favorable report to Senator Carozza's Bill, SB 823. Thank you for your time.
