The Maryland Public Health Association (MdPHA) would like to express support for House Bill 147. This bill would require local governments to develop climate crisis plans that ensure their communities have a comprehensive strategy to mitigate the impact of climate change to protect their citizens.

Climate change has been proved to have a significant impact on human health and infrastructure. Maryland is among the states most vulnerable to climate effects including increased storm intensity, poor air quality, food and water supply issues, and heat-related illness. By mandating county governments to create climate crisis plans, we are proactively addressing the health impacts of climate change and ensuring that Maryland communities are prepared for the challenges ahead. This bill brings a much-needed focus to the issue of climate change and provides a framework for local governments to address it.
