Jones Forever Maryland supports HB0503 - Natural Resources — Greenspace Equity Program — Establishment for the purpose of providing grants to land trusts or county/municipality for enhancing the public health and livability of overburdened communities and underserved communities by implementing projects to preserve, create, and enhance community greenspace.

The Greenspace Equity program seeks to allocate \$22M (over three years) and \$10M in year four and every year thereafter from Program Open Space (state-side) funds to create a grant program to acquire, improve and protect land aimed at increasing access to nature by creating community greenspaces to include – community gardens, woodlands, parks, trails, urban farms and other open space areas.

The Greenspace Equity Program will advance climate resilience, conservation, and equitable access to nature led by increasing resources available to overburdened and underserved communities. Acquisition and conservation of lands in areas with greater population density is often much more expensive, due to competing values for land.

Open, accessible spaces for passive recreation, nature connections, and community gathering provide valuable health benefits for Marylanders living in these communities in urban, suburban, and rural areas. Yet, many Maryland communities were developed without immediate greenspace.

Forever Maryland promotes and supports the land and water conservation community, through education, advocacy, and outreach, to permanently protect working landscapes and healthy ecosystems for all.
