Chesapeake Bay Foundation (CBF) **SUPPORTS** HB 1006 which directs the State Highway Administration to develop a pollinator habitat plan for state road rights of way.

Native plants that support pollinators protect the important functions of biodiversity and food production. One third of the plants humans eat require pollinators to produce the edible portion of the plants. Habitat destruction for native pollinators endangers our food supply. There is a great opportunity for land currently managed as lawns along state rights of way to instead support native pollinators. By doing so, the mowing frequency can be significantly reduced saving time, money, greenhouse gases and polluted runoff from these lands as they are currently managed.

CBF urges the Committee's FAVORABLE report on HB 1006.
