Given current wild oyster harvests, the only means of promoting a significant increase in the population is to dramatically reduce harvest pressure. One way to accomplish this is to incentivize the growth of the aquaculture fishery. Providing assistance for women- and minority-owned shellfish aquaculture businesses will increase the number of these enterprises in Maryland by helping them overcome traditional barriers to entry and success. We will never achieve our greatest economic potential until every citizen can participate in each sector of our economy. Broadening the field of participants in the oyster aquaculture industry will result in a positive economic impact for Maryland.
