RE: SB555 - Fair Wage Act of 2023 - Support

The Office of the Attorney General requests a favorable report on Governor Moore's Senate Bill 555 the Fair Wage Act of 2023. Senate Bill 555 accelerates the planned increase to a \$15 minimum wage, fully implementing that wage for all covered employers as of October 1, 2023. This legislation will increase the family income of hundreds of thousands of Marylanders. Beginning July 1, 2025, the bill further indexes the minimum wage to the Consumer Price Index, capped at 5% per annuum. Such indexing allows for employee wages to keep pace with inflation and provides more predictability for businesses who can plan around regularly scheduled, incremental increases in labor costs.

For the foregoing reasons the Office of the Attorney General requests a favorable report on Senate Bill 555.
