Re: HB 172 - Health Occupations - Athletic Trainers - Dry Needling

Dear Chair Pena-Melnyk and Vice-Chair Cullison:

At the favorable vote of HB172 at the Health and Government Operations Committee meeting on Friday, March 10th, it was represented by a legislator that the inclusion of certain amendments satisfied those opposing the bill, and that those parties now support the bill. This representation is <u>not</u> correct. The Board wanted to clarify that even with the inclusion of the corrections, the Board still opposes HB172. The Board stands by its position outlined in its letter to the committee that 80 hours of training isn't sufficient to grant approval for Athletic Trainers to insert needles in patients and presents a potential risk to patient safety.

I hope that this information clarifies the opposition's position in determining the fate of the legislation and its impact on the collective goal of protecting the public.
