RE: HB454- Health Occupations- Licenses, Certifications and Registrations- Immigrants-OPPOSE

Dear Chair Pena-Melnyk and Members of HGO Committee,

I am strongly urging you to oppose HB454. HB454 and its cross-filed bill SB0187 will allow illegal immigrants the privilege of to be certified for any health license and/or certification. This will cause competition between illegal immigrants and American citizens for employment where no such competition should exist. As legal, American, Maryland residents we should not be put in a situation where we are competing for a job with someone who is residing in Maryland illegally, while maintaining a citizenship of a foreign country. A poll in December 2022 revealed MD's unemployment rate to be 4.0% with a ranking of 35 out of 50 states. If HB454/SB187 are passed, this rate will increase.

Additionally, this bill authorizes the replacement of Social Security Numbers with TaxID and circumvents US Code 1324a-Unlawful Employment of Aliens which states:

(a) MAKING EMPLOYMENT OF UNAUTHORIZED ALIENS UNLAWFUL

(1)In GENERALIt is unlawful for a person or other entity—

(A)

to hire, or to recruit or refer for a fee, for employment in the <u>United States</u> an <u>alien</u> knowing the <u>alien</u> is an <u>unauthorized alien</u> (as defined in subsection (h)(3)) with respect to such employment, or

(B)

(i)

to hire for employment in the <u>United States</u> an individual without complying with the requirements of subsection (b) or (ii) if the person or <u>entity</u> is an agricultural association, agricultural employer, or farm labor contractor (as defined in <u>section 1802 of title 29</u>), to hire, or to recruit or refer for a fee, for employment in the <u>United States</u> an individual without complying with the requirements of subsection (b).

AND

(b) EMPLOYMENT VERIFICATION SYSTEM

(1)ATTESTATION AFTER EXAMINATION OF DOCUMENTATION (A)In general

The person or <u>entity</u> must attest, under penalty of perjury and on a form designated or established by the <u>Attorney General</u> by regulation, that it has verified that the individual is not an <u>unauthorized alien</u>

I therefore urge an UNFAVORABLE report from you and your committee against HB454.
