RE: HB 1224 - Public Schools – Medical and Psychological Treatment in School-Based Health Centers and Public Schools – Parental Notice – Letter of Opposition

Dear Chair Peña-Melnyk and Committee Members:

The Maryland Department of Health (MDH) is submitting this letter of opposition for House Bill (HB) 1224 – Public Schools – Medical and Psychological Treatment in School-Based Health Centers and Public Schools – Parental Notice. Under HB 1224, a school health practitioner, health care practitioner, or certified school psychologist employed to provide school health services at a public school, is required to provide to a student's parent or guardian information about any consultation, diagnosis, or treatment provided to the student.

HB 1224 conflicts with existing Maryland law. First, Health - General Article §20-102 defines situations where a minor has the same capacity as an adult to consent to medical treatment.¹ In these instances, while the health care practitioner may share information about the treatment with the minor's parent or guardian information, they are not required to do so. Furthermore, Health - General Article §20-104 expands the protections of minor consent to those 12 years old or older who are determined by a health care provider to be mature and capable of giving informed consent.²

Additionally, HB 1224's mandate for school health practitioners, health care practitioners, or certified school psychologists to provide a student's parent or guardian information about any consultation, diagnosis, or treatment has the potential to put that student in harm's way. For example, in the instance where a student seeks treatment resulting from sexual abuse inflicted by a parent or guardian, the mandated notification could potentially cause more harm to the student.
