HB 454 – Health Occupations – Licenses, Certificates, and Registrations - Immigrants - Request for Favorable Report

Dear Chairwoman Pena-Melnyk and Honorable Members of the House Health and Government Operations Committee

On behalf of the Maryland Military Coalition and as its Communication Director, I am requesting your **favorable report** on HB 454. For the record, my name is CAPTAIN Lynn Nash. I am a retired nurse, who completed over 30 years of active-duty service in both the Army and the U.S. Public Health Service. I am well acquainted with the issue.

This bill prohibits a health occupations board from denying a license, certification, or registration to an immigrant if the individual meets the requirements. For those unaware, the requirements for licensure are extensive. The applicant must:

- Meet the educational requirements
- Complete a foreign-educated nurses (FEN) course
- Take and pass an English language proficiency test, if mandated
- Pass the state's National Council Licensing Examination-Registered Nurse (NCLEX RN)
- Obtain credential evaluation
- Find a nursing recruiting agency or US-based employer
- Apply and obtain an RN immigrant visa/green card

These requirements are all encompassing to ensure that the applicant has the competencies needed to practice safely. As such, this legislation makes sense, especially in light of the current shortage of providers here in the state.

Currently, the U.S. Armed Forces are experiencing significant shortages. According to the <u>Defense Health Agency</u>, these shortages extend to clinical nurses, potentiating a degradation in the Service's ability to provide what has always been state-of-the-art-care to service members and their families.

Recruiting and retention considerations often include what benefits service members and their families will receive in exchange for the rigors of active duty on both the service member AND the family. Healthcare is at the top of the list. Passage of this bill offers another possible infusion of candidates seeking to serve in the U.S. Armed Services as well as the U.S. Public Health Service, each of which require an active U.S. nursing license to sign on.

The Maryland Military Coalition, is a **voluntary**, non-partisan **organization representing 19 veteran service organizations**, who, in turn, serve over 150,000 Maryland uniformed services men, women and their families. The Coalition *strongly supports* House Bill 454 – Health Occupations – Licenses, Certificates, and Registrations - Immigrants and asks for your *favorable report*.
