Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to give testimony in support of a commission on Universal Heath Care.

I personally am very much in support of Universal Health Coverage. As a retired nurse, during the course of my career, I had the opportunity to care for many people with little to no resources for help. I always felt that if they had better access to care, their diabetes would not be out of control, their blood pressure would be within safe limits and their cancers could have been caught at an earlier stage which would have enabled them to live longer and more productive lives instead of dying earlier than they might have.

The Episcopal Church supports comprehensive health care and recognizes the need for universal and equitable access for all.
