HB 1198:

Drug and Alcohol Treatment Programs – Discharge of Patients and Referral Services – Standards

My name is Rozina Adhanom, and I work for Montgomery County, MD, Department of Health and Human Services in the Services to End and Prevent homelessness division. One of the challenges our Continuum of Care faces is inappropriate discharges to emergency shelters from higher-level treatment programs. Our emergency shelters are neither intended to be a step-down psychiatric or treatment program nor can provide the level of care patients would receive at halfway houses or other appropriate recovery residences. Effective discharge planning can improve recovery rates and reduce relapse, especially for individuals admitted to congregated homeless shelters who would live with others that may be actively using, making it easy for people to fall back into those destructive habits.

This bill supports establishing targeted, contextually flexible interventions and specific policies and practices around discharge planning that meet the needs of people's path to recovery. Also, this bill helps to address the lack of discharge policies, identifiable processes, or plans specifically tailored to the homeless population, as it is currently a healthcare and policy gap.




Prior Living Situation






Prior Living Situation - Adult/Child Households (Families)


