HB 699 State and Local Government-Proof of Vaccination for Employees and Applicants for Employment – Prohibition (Vaccination by Choice Act)

Position: FAVORABLE with Amendment

I am writing in strong support of House Bill 699 with the amendment.

The current boosters have proven ineffective at curbing infection and stopping the transmission of the Covid virus. Current strains of the virus are less virulent and most of the population has already been exposed to the virus.

At this point, it should be the students' choice as to whether or not they take the booster shot—not their admitting university.
