

## Testimony on SB365/HB588 Access to Care Act of 2023 Position: Favorable with Amendments<sup>1</sup>

To Chair Griffith and Members of the Senate Finance Committee; Chair Pena-Melnyk and Members of the Health & Government Operations Committee,

My name is Teneia Wells and I am a healthcare worker at a long-term care facility in Baltimore County. I'm a member of 1199SEIU United Healthcare Workers East. We are the largest healthcare workers union in the country, with over 10,000 members in Maryland and Washington DC. Our union supports SB365 – Access to Care Act – and we urge the Committee to issue a **favorable** report. This legislation will ensure immigration status is not a barrier for Marylanders to accessing healthcare and will create a subsidy program so healthcare can be more affordable.
