Dry needling is acupuncture, and to allow Athletic Trainers to perform this skill with only 80 hours of training not only pales in comparison to what is required to practice Chinese medicine safely and effectively but seems both a risk and liability for the patients they will serve.

I therefore align with the consideration that the standards of education and training should be as rigorous as what is required for physicians who use acupuncture needles for similar therapeutic purposes, in order to protect the public and ensure the integrity and value of Traditional Chinese medicine is upheld.
