throughout the state, asks the House Health and Government Operations Committee to FAVORABLY report on Senate Bill 101 which provides for Medical Assistance coverage through an integrative care model, known

as the collaborative care model, which is currently funded as a pilot program. We support and encourage all

integrated primary care and behavioral health models, one of which is the collaborative care model. MPA has

been working with stakeholders to ensure that the collaborative care model operates to its fullest

potential and with the fullest complement of mental health providers including psychologists. We

realize the amount of time and effort that has gone into developing the current model and the importance of

moving mental health care in the direction of integrative care. As a result, we withdrew our initial amendments

We welcome the opportunity to work with the sponsoring legislators on both the House and Senate side of this bill, the MHAMD, and other stakeholders to develop and implement other forms of evidence-based integrative

primary and behavioral health models that can be less costly. A part of this future discussion would be to consider improvements to the integrated care models that recognize all four of the Medicare approved codes for behavioral

health integration services that would allow for more flexibility, the inclusion of psychologists at levels appropriate
