### Vote Yes on Senate Bill 486

Bill Title: Baltimore City Sheriff- Staffing Hearing Date: February 23, 2023 Judicial Committee

### Greetings, Chair, Vice Chair, and members of the Committee:

Today, I respectfully ask for your support in approving Senate Bill 486. Senate Bill 486 enhances the number of positions available at the Baltimore City Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff's Office of Baltimore has a history of leadership, conflict resolution, authority, and devotion to our city. For 178 years member of the Sheriff's office has done their due diligence in upkeeping the peace of Baltimore, Maryland.

Upon request, SB486 will grant the necessary funding to expand the Sheriff's Office. With the execution of Senate Bill 486, the proper size of staff will be directed by the Sheriff.

Currently, the Sheriff's Office has two Assistant Sheriff positions in place. We ask for approval of adding two more command-level superiors to manage the Sheriff's Office. In approving Senate Bill 486 the Sheriff's Office will have the ability to obtain a larger role in service to Baltimore city.

If passed Senate Bill 486 will administer social workers to connect tenants facing eviction with services. This program doesn't exist in the office currently, but with additional workers, the implementation of this new process will benefit all. There will be designated personnel conducting evictions to provide connections to the emergency placement and rehousing services. In the event of an eviction, having a social worker present increases the likelihood of an organized and smooth process for families. Among other things, social workers provide a sense of empathy that is critical for unforeseen circumstances like that.

For these reasons, I humbly request your support in approving Senate Bill 486.
