POSITION: Support

The Maryland Judiciary supports Senate Bill 704. This bill amends Criminal Procedure Title 4, Subtitle 2 related to the confinement of a child who is charged as an adult.

This bill is intended to put Maryland into compliance with the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act, § 11133(a)(11). Failure to comply with that language may have financial consequences for the state in terms of funding received through the act. Holding a child in a juvenile facility is appropriate unless the enumerated factors, determined by the court, show that placement is not in the interest of justice.

Additionally, this bill provides for a clear and seamless holding of the child in a juvenile facility, unless released, regardless of the status of any motion to transfer jurisdiction and until such time as there is a decision in the criminal case or the child turns age 18 years.
