On July 22, 2022, I completed the Gaudenzia program successfully and I kept my vow; I returned to America Works and acquired a full-time position thanks to the resume made for me and the dedicated staff, willing to support me with bus passes and wraparound services. On August 26, 2022, I began working at Form Services Inc. as a Forklift Driver. I still work there in a full-time capacity *to this day*.

Just imagine for a minute that someone who has never held down a job before in their entire life now works for a living after serving three plus decades in prison; that is truly amazing and should be commended. I am in full support of the America Works team and their mission to ensure hard-to-place job seekers find full-time employment. All in all, the America Works program does indeed work!
