## HB0481 Criminal Law - Wearing, Carrying, or Transporting a Handgun - Penalty

Stance: Unfavorable

<u>Testimony:</u> My name is Adiena Britt and I reside within the 45<sup>th</sup> Legislative district. I am testifying against this proposal to increase the penalty for handgun violations from three to five years. This Bill seems to be part of a short-sighted campaign put forth by some State's Attorneys in the state.
