**POSITION:** Support

The Maryland Judiciary supports House Bill 591. This bill provides that a court may not assess costs on a person or governmental unit who is ordered to receive restitution when recording and indexing a money judgement in any court in the state.

Currently if a victim of a crime is awarded a judgment, it is entered in the judgment index in the county that issued the judgment for free. However, if a clerk were presented that same judgment in another county in Maryland to record, they would have to charge a fee of \$15 before it could be recorded under the current statute. This bill would resolve that inequity.
