**Re: HB729 - Real Property – Sheriff’s Sales – Notice, Procedures, and Subordinate Interests**

**Hearing: March 8, 2023**

**Position: OPPOSE**

Dear Chairman Clippinger, Vice Chairman Moon, Delegate Grossman, Delegate Buckel, Delege Henson, Delegate Hinebaugh, Jr., and Committee Members:

This letter is submitted on behalf of the Maryland Legislative Action Committee (“MD-LAC”) of the Community Associations Institute (“CAI”). CAI MD-LAC represents individuals and professionals who reside in, or work with, condominiums, homeowners’ associations, and cooperatives throughout the State of Maryland.

MD-LAC is writing today to voice our opposition against HB729. The bill requires a judgment creditor provide written notice to certain persons regarding the time, place, and terms of the sale of any real property subject to a sheriff’s sale at least 20 days before the property can be sold, and to file an affidavit affirming compliance with this notice requirement. However, sheriff’s

offices, not judgment creditors, schedule sheriff's sales, and there is no collaboration between sheriff's offices and judgment creditors regarding when a sheriff's sale should be scheduled. A judgment creditor finds out that the sheriff's office has scheduled its requested sheriff's sale at the same time as the general public. Under these circumstances, requiring the judgment creditor to send additional written notices regarding the sale is impractical and unduly burdensome; it would also effectively deprive judgment creditors of a statutorily authorized remedy to execute court awarded judgments in their favor.

Accordingly, we respectfully request that the Committee give HB729 an unfavorable report. We are available to answer any questions which you may have.
