



**HB 1191 – Task Force on Preventing and Countering Elder Abuse**

**Position:** Favorable With Amendments

The Maryland Bankers Association (MBA) **SUPPORTS** HB 1191 **WITH AMENDMENTS**. This bill would establish the Task Force on Preventing and Countering Elder Abuse. MBA is in full support of any cooperative effort to prevent elder financial abuse, and wishes to have involvement in this Task Force to ensure that the banking industry is a partner in protecting older Marylanders.

Banks play a huge role in combatting financial exploitation by looking for signs that transactions are being made under undue influence and bankers across the country receive training on the signs of exploitation at least once a year. Last year, the General Assembly passed legislation to clear the path for financial institutions to work directly with the Department of Human Services to assist in exploitation investigations, and financial institutions can use investigation results to tailor their employee training.

As banks are at the forefront of protecting a customer's funds, the MBA requests that the banking industry have a seat on this task force. Accordingly, MBA urges issue a **FAVORABLE** report on HB 1191 **WITH AMENDMENTS**.
