Further:

As a MD citizen with a physical disability and an authorized Maryland Handicap Parking Tag since 2014, I attest to you that when needed, I was able to request a mail-in ballot and then safely mail my ballot in via the USPS or drop in a drop box, thus there is for every possible disabled person's desire to vote safely and more securely than via a curbside location. Curbside poses many risks most predominantly physical harm which could be greater than the voter's first disability.
